Hotel Map

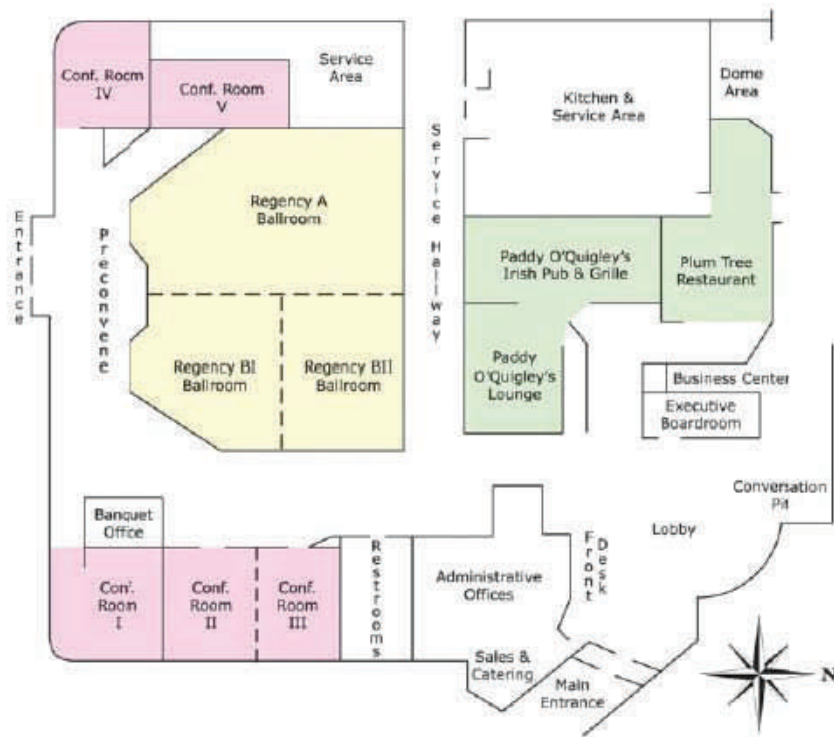

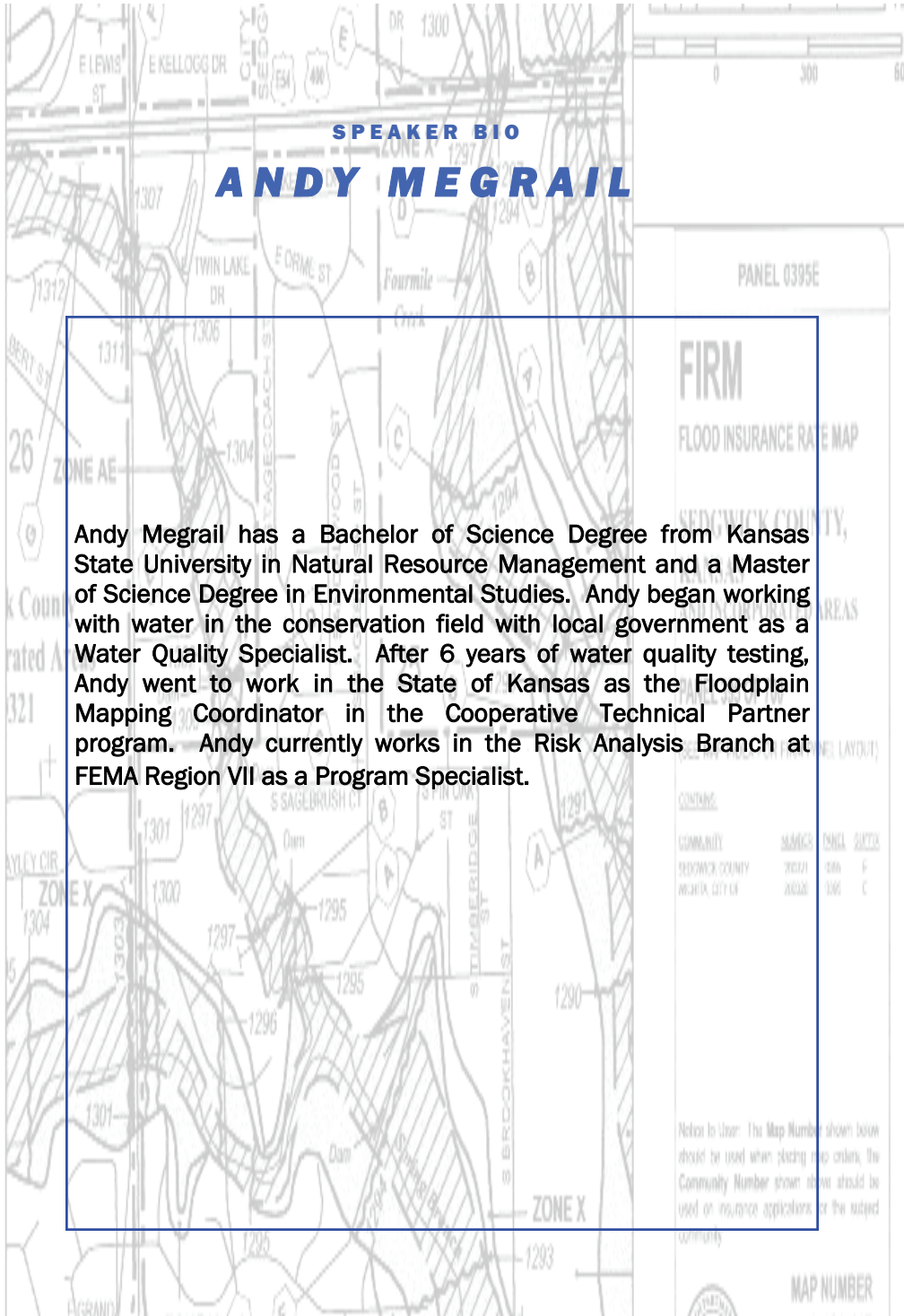
SPEAKER BIO

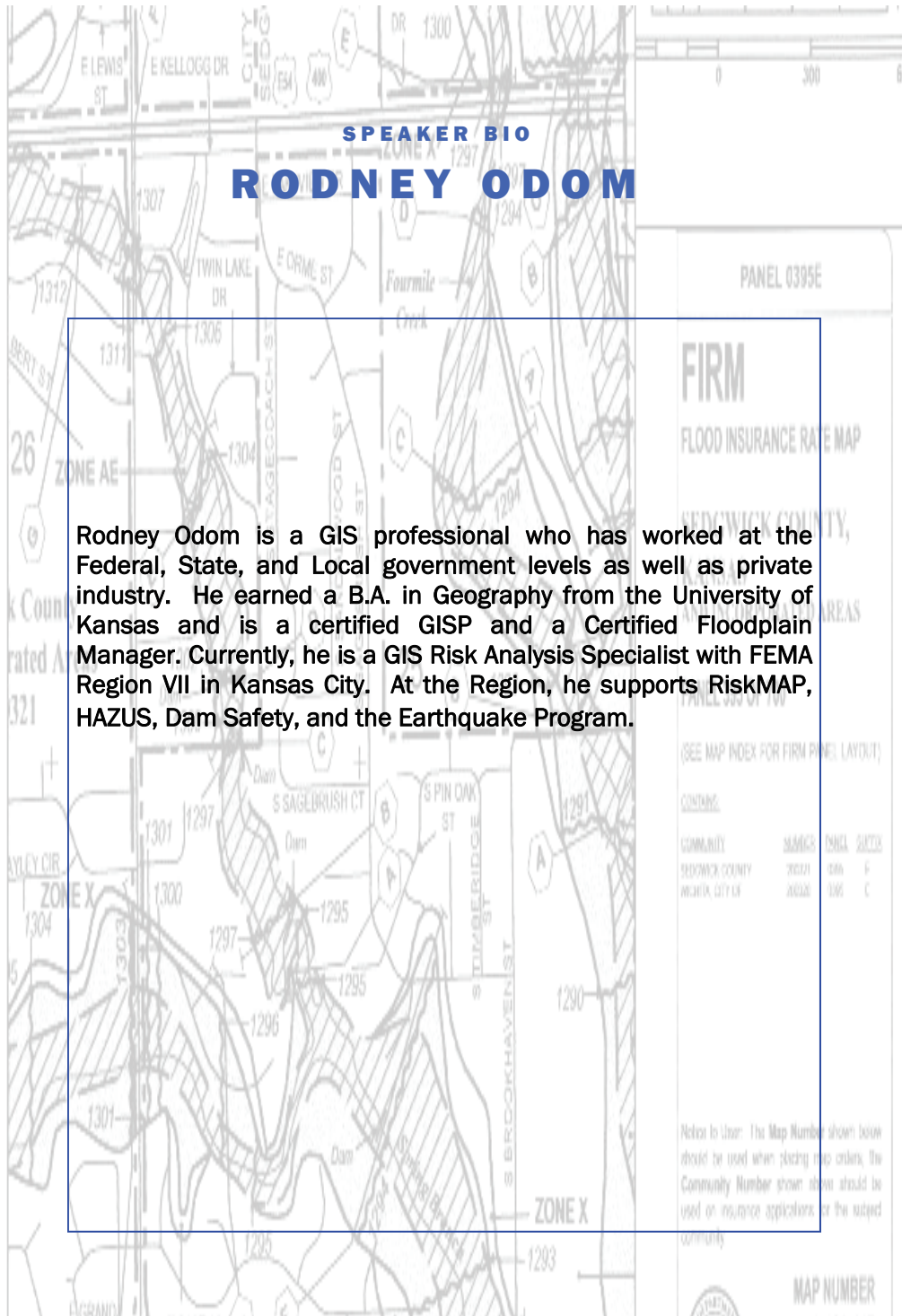
TOM MOREY

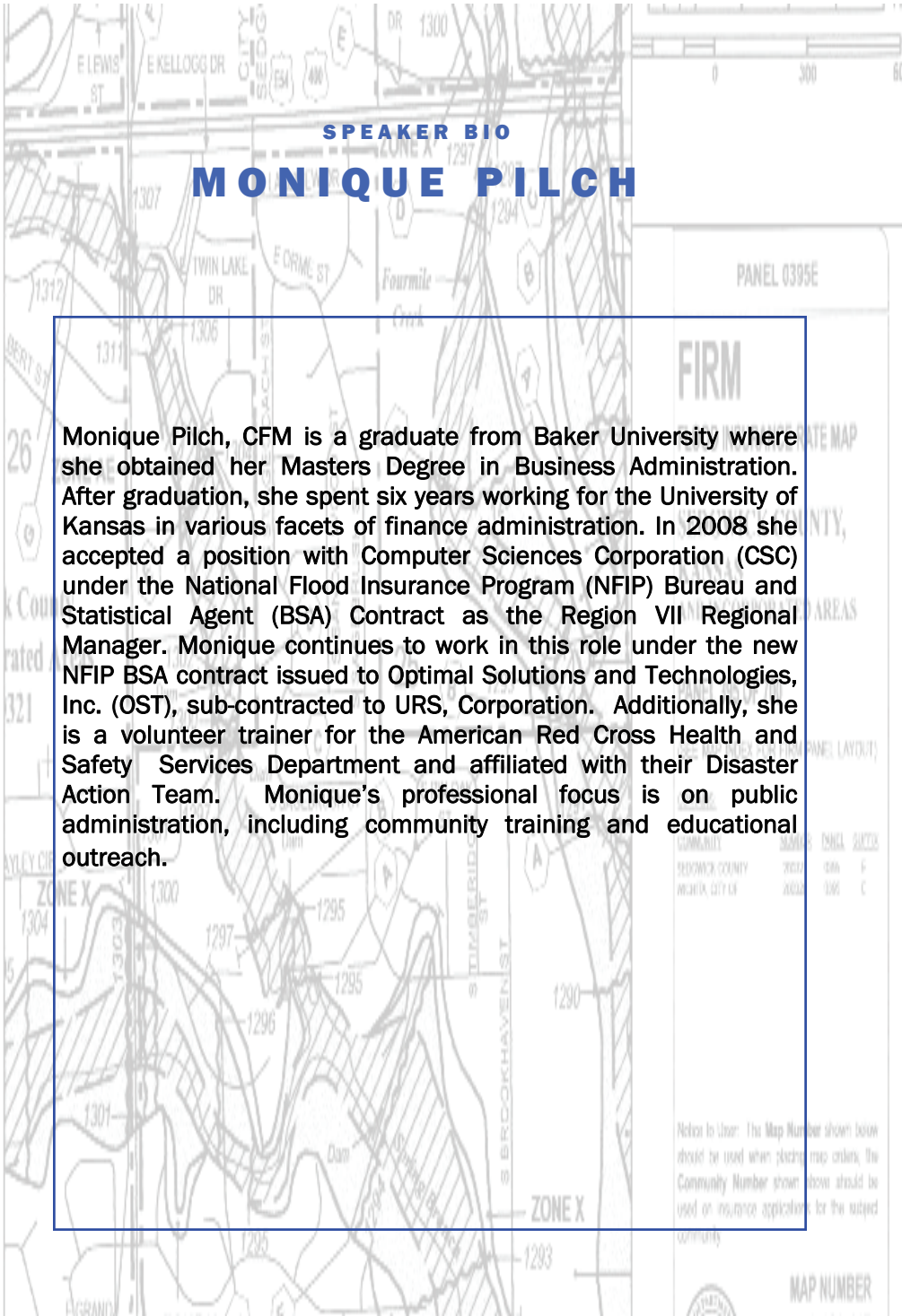

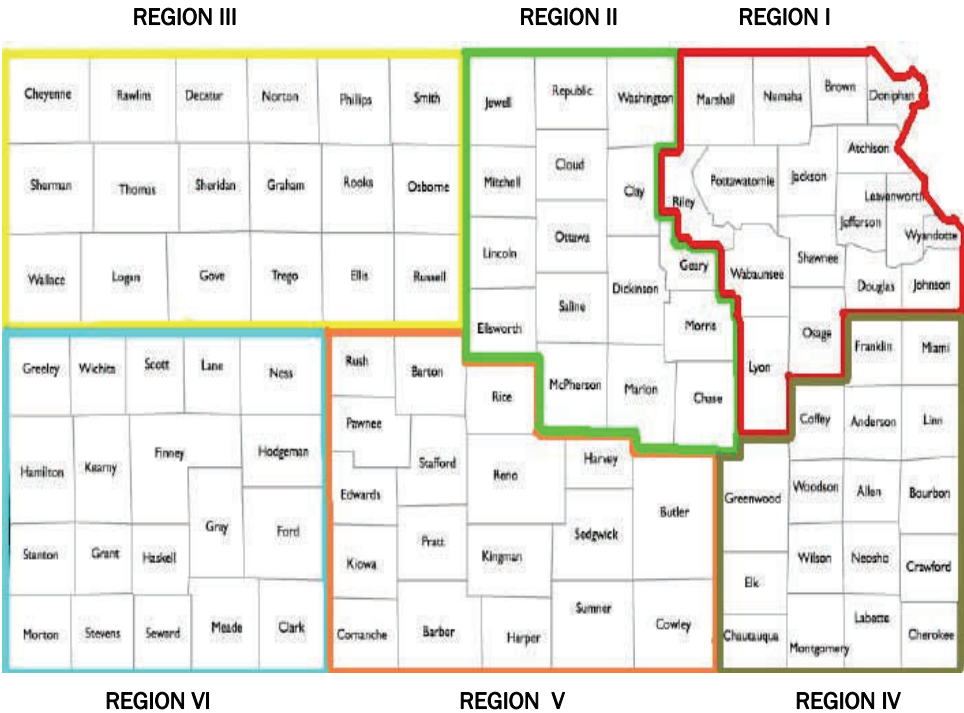
